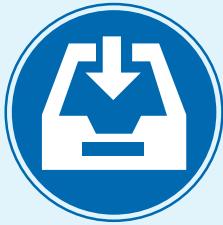

My tour started on Friday 9th October, when I met up with Peter Wilson and Nathan Burgess at Perth Airport. Thanks to Nathan for picking us up!

Then onward we headed to Yarrabah Farm Stay, where most of the other travellers were already settled in. On arrival we went and looked at the cow and calf group. The studs are based at Yarrabah – Wayne and Belinda Owston’s “Ranfurley” stud, Hayley Goad’s “Bellahway” stud, and Nathan Burgess and Felicity Vney’s “Juniper” stud. The cattle are mostly show cattle, which go to local shows and Perth Royal Show. Wayne said that he liked to use AI sires, so there was a fair mix of sires with calves on the ground – it was good to compare the calves.

Saturday morning saw the group divided up into cars and headed out, stopping to look at the heifers on the way out. The heifers were a mixed herd of Red Polls, Guernseys, Jerseys and Holsteins.

Next stop was at Karragullen to view Paul Ghilarducci’s herd “Karradace” stud. The property also has a plum orchard and is a rose farm, supplying rose plants to Bunnings in WA. Karradace is based on Ranfurley and Yongerellen lines.

The herd is run as a mixed herd of Red Polls and Murray Greys, with the commercial aspect in mind. 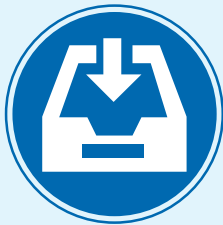

## The season in WA has turned very dry over a large area including the normally safe south coast and south west regions

I hear reports from the south coast that stock have been turned back in onto paddocks which were shut up for hay because of lack of rain and subsequent lack of growth for hay. Stock water will also be an issue. As a result livestock prices have fallen and may not stop yet.

Some of the great southern around Darkan way is exceptionally dry for them. The central wheatbelt lacked a good September rain to finish the crops so yield estimates are rapidly declining. Having said that, there are patches that I saw yesterday on different soil types that have done remarkably well but expected overall averages are down. Harvest there is in early stages. The northern and northeastern wheatbelts have had one of their better seasons for some time due to several early season rains. Some there have been harvesting since late September and Esperance is having a bumper year. Some of you will know Doug Giles from Quicksilver transport and Charolais stud.

His property copped a severe thunder storm on Sat night (17th) creating infrastructure damage and wiping out many crops, some totally. Cunderdin an hour north of here has an October temp average 6 degrees above normal.

Good entries were at Perth Royal from six exhibitors, with favourable comments from Judge Ian Coghlan

Senior champion and Grand Champion bull was Red Sands Simba and Yongerellen Wattle Janelle was Senior and Grand champion female and Supreme exhibit. Both junior champions went to Wand B Owston while other exhibitors all picked up awards.

Only a few animals are to be exhibited at Brunswick show this year but the Region will present a Plaque to the Brunswick Show Society after judging in commemoration of their assistance for the World Congress Tour last year.

## Yongerellen reduction sale hits \$2600

PRICES hit a high of \$2600 in the Yongerellen and Red Sands Red Poll reduction sale held on AuctionsPlus on Monday.

Combined, the two studs from Quairading offered 35 cows (some with calves at foot and others due to calve), 13 heifers and two bulls and by Tuesday morning all but one bull had been sold to strong stud and commercial inquiry.

The cow and calf units averaged \$1410, the PTIC cows \$1110 and the heifers \$580.

Strong support in the sale came from not only WA but also the eastern seaboard, with many of the top animals bound for a trip across the Nullarbor.

Yongerellen stud principal Murray Williams said it was a successful sale thanks to the extremely strong clearance.

"There was a good spread of buyers with cattle selling not only to WA buyers but producers in northern and southern New South Wales and southern Queensland," he said.

"Not only was there strong stud interest in the sale there was also good commercial interest as well.

"It was our first time using AuctionsPlus and I think it worked well.

"We did have a few issues with its operations because we were not familiar with it, but I think it is a very good system and it was excellent not having to shift cattle to saleyards for the sale."

Mr Williams said the main reason behind the sale was to reduce his workload as he heads towards retirement.

"We had always intended to reduce our numbers this year after leasing out more of the farm as I head towards retirement," he said.

Elders stud stock manager Tim Spicer said the sale received good registrations on AuctionsPlus from across Australia.

"I am more than happy with the result with near on everything selling within five hours of the sale's completion," Mr Spicer said.

"The sale provided an opportunity to use the AuctionsPlus interface for a reduction sale given the distance from Murray's property to the nearest saleyards and I think it worked well."

Topping the sale at \$2600 was an eight-year-old matron, Red Sands Mandissa C52, when it sold to Eurimbla stud, Gerogery, New South Wales.

The dark, smooth cow, with plenty of depth and femininity is by Yongerellen Afro Domain and was sold with a seven-week-old heifer calf at foot.

Mandisa is the dam of Red Sands Simba, which was sashed the senior and grand champion Red Poll bull at this year's IGA Perth Royal Show.

Also making an impression on buyers from the Red Sands stud was Red Sands Olympia when it was sold at \$1850 to Eurimbla.

The large 6yo cow, which shows plenty of volume, is by Yongerellen Romeo Englander and was sold with a three-week-old heifer calf at foot.

The \$1850 price tag was a popular bid in the sale with two more females attracting this level of support and both of these were from the Yongerellen stud.

Bidding hit \$1850 for the 6yo Yongerellen Esma Impiety E13 and the 7yo Yongerellen Wattle Hernani D02.

Esma Impiety is renowned for breeding calves with above average growth and below average birthweight and was purchased by Eurimbla.

It is by Yongerellen Phoenix Endeavour and was sold with a seven-week-old bull calf.

The long-bodied Wattle Hernani is by Yongerellen Afro Domain and was sold with a nine-week-old heifer calf and purchased by Elders Corrigin.

Also making good money in the sale was Yongerellen Esme Heiress D06 which sold for \$1800 to TB Lee & Co, Omega 3 stud, Quirindi, NSW.

Esme Heiress, which shows good muscle expression, is by Phoenix Endeavour and has a five-week-old bull calf at foot.

Rounding out the better prices in the sale was the \$1750 paid by Eurimbla for the three-year-old Yongerellen Gracious Laydee H59.

Gracious Laydee is a daughter of Yongerellen Apex Cousin, which has been sashed an interbreed

champion at the Perth Royal Show.

Gracious Laydee is from an outstanding female line and is PTIC and due to calve in October.

The top-priced pen of heifers, consisting of three head, made \$650 when purchased by Michael and Vicki O'Neill, Southern Brook.

Along with securing the pen of heifers, the O'Neill family purchased five cows to a top of \$1400 and a five-year-old bull, Yongerellen Endeavour Janitor F12, for \$1800.
